In the camp office we are updating the BBC dates on the website, sending out invitations for FLIGHT 2010. Updating manu-

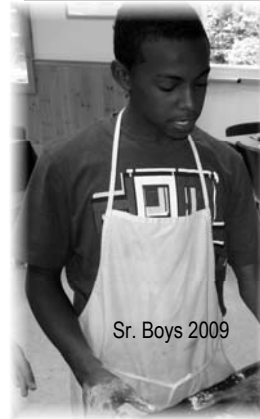
als, preparing for the annual meeting and answering email...

Things Concerning Himself

When he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place. "Do you understand what I have done for you?" he asked them.

John 11:34

The question that Jesus asks in the above verse is directed at the disciples, but on another level it seems as though He is speaking to us as well. What is Jesus teaching us through this question?

I can imagine the disciples staring down at their feet. Feet that have just been washed by their Rabbi or teacher. Even Peter does not respond to the question that was asked. Leaders lead and servants serve, everyone knows that. But here is their leader, serving. Washing their feet!

The Lord Jesus then explains (which means that they did not understand) that he is teaching servant leadership. Many of us in our roles at camp will be given the opportunity to lead at some point; campers, staff, cooks there are many opportunities. How will we follow Christ's example and lead by serving? The human thing is to show people how important we are but Jesus sets a different standard for us. Are we up for it?

The first step is to agree-are we willing to lead by serving? It is important to agree.

The second step is to 'do it.' Jesus says that the blessing comes when we demonstrate what we know with our actions.

Into the Woods?

Brown Creeper

What is the smallest bird to stay the winter at Beacon? It's not the chickadee, or the nuthatch, but the brown creeper. This shy, cryptically-coloured little bird is not easily seen or heard. As its name suggests, it spends a good deal of its time creeping up the trunks of mature trees, where it checks the crevices in the bark for food -- hibernating insects, larva or eggs. Sometimes it visits a bird feeder, though usually it just picks up the tiny scraps of suet dropped onto the ground by the other birds.

It is especially vulnerable because of its small size, which creates a large core-to-body ratio, which means it has a harder time staying warm.

You would think it would just fly south, so it wouldn't have to cope with our long, cold winters. Migration, and wintering in the south, both have their own perils for small birds. So it stays, and somehow manages to eke out an existence right here in Muskoka, despite having to struggle to keep warm and fed.

The brown creeper is an illustration of how the Lord takes care of us in difficult circumstances. The circumstances don't necessarily change, but the Lord sustains us.

The Paperwork Challenge-

The 2010 Challenge!

Everyone loves a challenge. This is a Beacon Bible Camp staff challenge that we can all work on together. Let's make this the best year for staff completing all the forms that are needed to serve at BBC. Some of us are excellent at completing that paperwork and sending it in to the camp office and we thank-you for the special effort that you put into that!

This year, let's all make a point of getting that paperwork in to the camp office so that we can do our due diligence towards our goal of keeping our campers safe for 2010. There are three main documents that camp staff need to

complete before they serve at camp.

1. They need to complete a staff reference form. Part of this form needs to be completed by a leader at their church, chapel or assembly.
2. Everyone also needs to sign the BBC Doctrinal Statement.
3. At least every three years all staff need to perform a criminal record check as well.

The first two forms are available from the camp website. Call the camp office if you need help getting the Criminal Record done.

It is tempting to let a few rules slide in order to be nice, but this will only increase your problems.

Cabin Leading 101

The following excerpt is taken from the BBC FLIGHT Manual. It highlights some of the responsibilities of a cabin leader.

Be a leader. You may feel inadequate for the job, but your campers—and the camp staff—will expect you to behave like a leader. If you are afraid of thunderstorms (and it seems as if there's at least one heart-stopping, ear-shattering storm every week of camp), your campers will be afraid too. Your fears, happiness, or enthusiasm are infectious. Keep a positive outlook. You set an example as well in your attitude toward the camp rules. If you don't obey and enforce them, you can't expect obedience from your campers. It is tempting to let a few rules

slide in order to be nice, but this will only increase your problems. Perhaps the most important influence you wield is your approach to spiritual things. Some campers will regard you as the ideal Christian, while others will be watching to see if Christ is a reality in your life. Cabin devotions provide an excellent opportunity to meet your camper's spiritual needs and develop their interest in the Word of God. However, if your attitude is, "Well, kids, we have to have devotions before Lights Out, so let's get them over," they will probably regard Bible study and prayer as uninteresting and worthless.
